- Tram 71 - supprimé jusqu'en 2008, mais remplacé par le bus 54
- Terminus du tram 54 - 4km
- Terminus du tram 4 - 4,2km
- Gare Uccle Calvoet - 1,2km et prendre le bus De Lijn R53 ou R54

Les lignes de bus suivantes

passent par Drogenbos :

- Ligne 50 (STIB) : relie la Gare du Midi à la chaussée de Neerdaal, offrant une liaison directe avec Drogenbos.
- Ligne 75 (STIB) : circule entre Coxe-Steille et Van Haelst, avec un itinéraire prolongé jusqu'à Drogenbos pour pallier l'interruption temporaire du tram 75 en raison de travaux sur la chaussée de Neerdaal.
- Ligne R53 (De Lijn) : assure la liaison entre Anderlecht, Drogenbos, Borsel et Halle AZ.
- Ligne R55 (De Lijn) : relie Nieuwe, Leerbeek, Halle, Molenberg et Anderlecht, en passant par Drogenbos.
- Ligne R55 (De Lijn) : relie Halle AZ, Sint-Gereonis-Rode et Anderlecht, avec des arrêts à Drogenbos.
- Ligne R10 (De Lijn) : relie Jette 12, Drogenbos, Anderlecht, Buisson et Halle, desservant également Drogenbos.

Château Calmeyn



Located in Drogenbos, on the outskirts of Brussels, Château Calmeyn is a 19th-century jewel, a testament to the refinement and elegance of its time. Built between 1852 and 1853 by the renowned architect Jean-Pierre Cluysenaar, it embodies the Italian influence in Belgian neo-classical architecture. Formerly called Château Rey, it was passed on at the end of the nineteenth century to the Calmeyn family, several members of whom have marked the history of Drogenbos as burgomasters. Surrounded by a 33-hectare green estate, once an integral part of the Soignes Forest, the castle is a treasure trove of nature and history. Its landscaped gardens offer an idyllic setting for walking, with majestic hundred-year-old trees, shaded paths and a magnificent lake surrounded by flowery spaces that change with the seasons. A true timeless refuge, the estate retains the bucolic and prestigious atmosphere of the great aristocratic residences of the nineteenth century.
